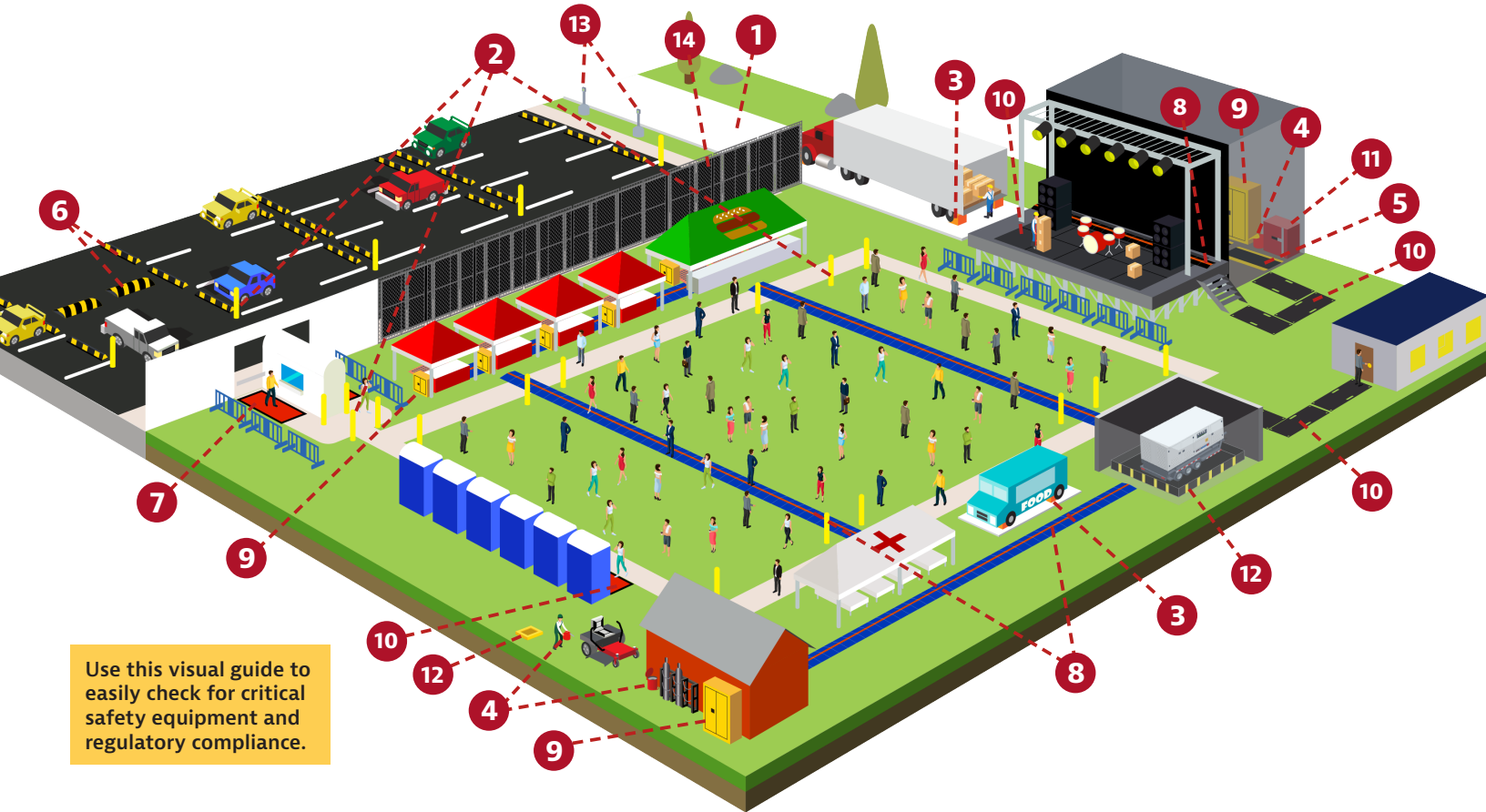


Entertainment Venue Safety Map
